A Get-up to Giddy up



With this costume you and a friend can be a horse together.

You need:

- 2 strong paper grocery bags for the horse's head.
- 1 grocery bag for the mane, tail, and ears.
- scissors
- tape
- paint and brushes
- a large square of cloth for horse's body
- safety pins

You Do:

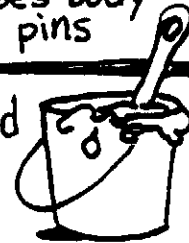

Cut a slit in the square of cloth long enough to go around the middle of the person standing in front. Safety pins help you to get a perfect fit.

Paint the head and body.



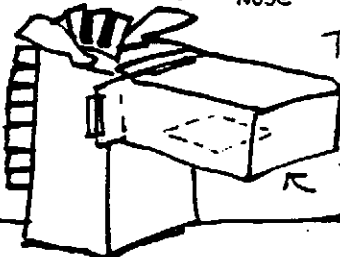
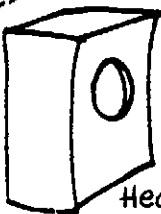

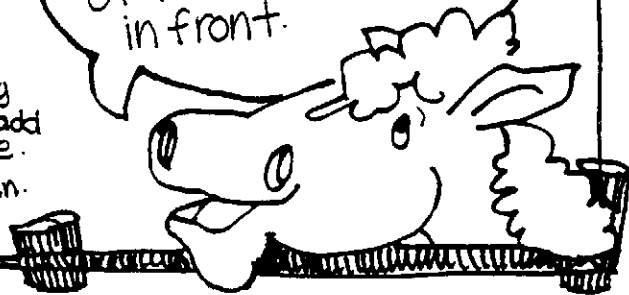
Make the horse's head like this:

One of you bends over and holds onto the waist of the other standing in front.

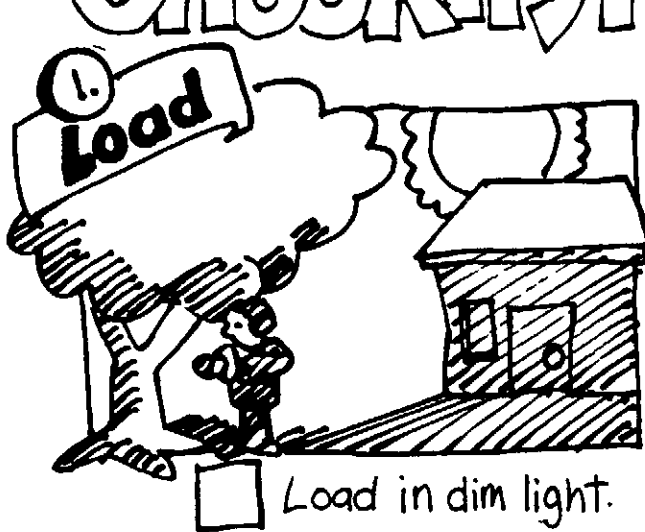

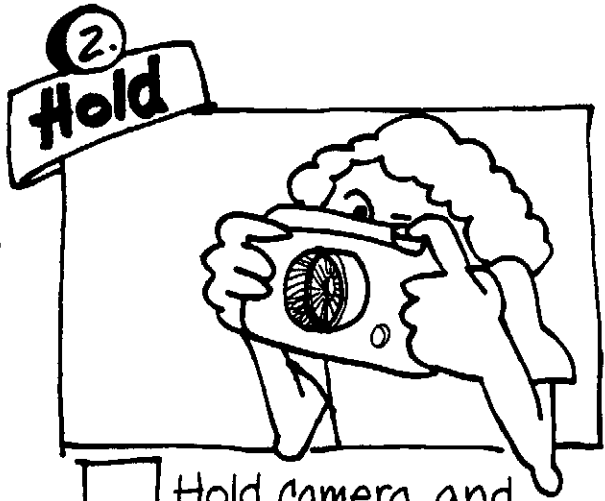
Listen to a tape recording of soft instrumental music. Draw things the music makes you think about.
