## **Selected Economic Impacts**

- Received more than \$199,603 in grants to support programming.
- Agents working through collaborating partners received in-kind/monetary donations with a value of \$35,548.
- Volunteers donated 10,112 hours to St.
   Johns County residents to assist programming.
   This is equivalent to \$266,147 of value (based on 2020 Independent Sector data; \$26.32/hr.)
   or 4 full-time and 1 three quarter time employees for 1 year.
- Agents developed 326 unbiased, scientifically sound, educational pieces for the public related to their subject matter.

# Selected 2021 Programmatic Highlights



- Fifteen-hundred and ninety-two (1,592) students and thirty-six (36) teachers participated in the UF/IFAS Chicken Embryology Projects, that is led by our 4-H Agent. Teachers who participated in the project reported that students gained a deeper understanding of the life cycle and needs of a developing embryo, increased skills in observation and recording data, and increased their love of science.
- Our Horticulture agent partnered with St. Johns
   County Librarian to create 5 interview videos for
   social media for their segment on Edible Gardening
   in St. Johns County that included topics such as
   composting, fertilizer, and organic gardening.
- Our Production Agriculture Agent conducting 49
   logged flights for a duration of 7 hours and 4 minutes using UAS (drones) for various research and demonstration projects that included potatoes, artichokes, sweet corn, sunflowers, pastures, sweet potatoes, sod, fresh market green beans and pumpkins in the Tri-county Area.
- As the 4-H State Archery Chair, one of our 4-H
  Agents planned, coordinated, and managed two state
  archery matches. A total of 59 youth from around the
  state participated in these matches. By youth
  participating in 4-H Shooting Sports, they learn
  environmental science, decision making, engineering,
  personal safety, and communication skills.
- The UF/IFAS Extension Associate Dean for Ag Programs recruited our Commercial Agriculture Agent to participate in the statewide pesticide leadership team – PEET (pesticide extension education team). This group helps to train other agents on how to offer exams and CEU programs, while updating our clients on new pesticide laws and label changes. The agent was chosen for her background in pesticide fate and transport in citrus.
- Two hundred (200) participants attended 24 community education, health and wellness classes such as "Lets Walk Florida", "Exploring your Health Indicators Inflammation and Diseases webinar", "Nutrition for Women", and "Elements of Healthy Aging", led by our Family and Consumer Sciences/ Food Systems agent.
- The Hastings Triage Lab, managed by our Commercial Ag Agent provided diagnostics for 66 crop and soil samples, including eggplant, potatoes, artichokes, beans, soil sniffing for fumigants, and processing Brassica samples.

- One-hundred and forty-six (146) participants attended 4 Florida-Friendly Landscaping workshops taught by UF/IFAS Extension SJC Horticulture Department. Participants learned about selecting the right plant for the right place, plant morphology and identification, and mangroves.
- In collaboration with UF/IFAS NFREC-Live Oak, the Commercial Ag Agent teamed up with local extension agents and Harrell's Fertilizer to conduct a trial utilizing controlled-release fertilizers in snapbeans. Bean production is expanding and is up to 500 acres in SJC.
- Our Horticulture Agent trained fifteen (15)
   participants for the 2021 Master Gardener
   Volunteer (MGV) Training program. This program
   provided over 50 hours of education and hands-on
   training to participants, who will in turn, donate 75
   hours of volunteer service during their first year as
   MGVs to educational gardening programs and projects
   throughout the county.
- Two-hundred and ninety-six (296) participants attended two in-service trainings for Extension faculty and health and nutrition related professionals, Elements of Health Aging Dietary Guidelines for Americans: Recommendations for Adults for Healthy Aging and Building Bodies and Balance: Healthy Aging Programs taught by our FCS/Food Systems Agent.
- Our Production Ag Agent assisted the State-wide <u>Livestock Education and Certification for</u> <u>Agriculture Law Enforcement (LECALE)</u> by providing educational materials related to body condition scoring and Animal Handling to 25 Agriculture Deputies from 19 Florida Sheriff's Departments.
- The Commercial Ag and Food Systems Extension Agents took the 4-H Pumpkin Project youth to the St. Augustine Amphitheater's Farmer's Market on October 30<sup>th</sup>. The youth acquired survey data, from more than 200 participants, on the public's most eye-catching pumpkin variety grown by HAEC. From this data we learned that the 'Porcelain Doll' variety was the fan favorite.
- Fifty-Eight (58) attendees took part in the St. Johns County 4-H Holiday Craft Teaching Night where

youth and adult volunteers partnered in teaching a variety of crafts. This event required the craft teachers to use their communication and public speaking skills and the learners to utilize their problem solving, creativity and decision-making skills.
