Participant Requirements:


- 1. Submit application and go through interview at the Alachua County Extension Office
- 2. Agree to reference and background check

3. Agree to attend mandatory face to face 40 hour training and pay \$175.00 registration fee (covering cost of program supplies and volunteer materials)

- 4. Agree to follow rules and guidelines set fort by UF/IFAS Extension Alachua County
- 5. Pass test to become a Certified Master Food and Nutrition Volunteer for Alachua County
- 6. Commit to donating 40 hours of approved service back to the community within one year of training

How To Apply:

- 1. Complete Master Food Volunteer application
- 2. Return completed application and fee to the Alachua County Extension Office by deadline
- 3. Application Deadline: March 13, 2018 into the Alachua County Extension Office
