Health Issues to Know



Brain Abscess: Abscess forms in the brain after head injury, creating CWD like symptoms.

Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease: suite of viruses that lead to internal hemorrhage, emaciation, lameness, and oral ulcers.

Cutaneous Fibroma: Virus that causes wart-like hairless blemishes.

Arterial Worm & Food Impaction: Worms that cause facial paralysis and allow food to accumulate in the jaw area.

Nasal Bots: Larval bot flies found in the nasal passages.

Chronic Wasting Disease under surveillance in Florida



Pseudorabies: Contagious infectious disease caused by a herpes virus, PRV. Feral swine are the main reservoir.

Swine Brucellosis: A bacterial disease that can be transferred to humans when dressing or eating improperly cooked feral swine.



Avian Influenza: A highly pathogenic virus that can be found in many species but is especially dangerous to birds.

Avian Pox: Caused by a virus, avipox virus. Major disease of wild turkeys causing wart-like or scabby lesions to unfeathered areas of the bird.

Newcastle Disease: Virus that does not always cause illness in wild birds, waterfowl seem to be more affected. Can be transmitted to domestic birds, especially poultry.



Mange: A parasitic mite which burrows under the skin causing significant irritation & hair loss. Affects coyotes, foxes, and raccoons, but other animals are susceptible.

Canine Distemper Virus: Neurological disease affecting foxes, coyotes, raccoons, skunks, and otters. Rabies: Virus that causes neurological symptoms and abnormal behavior.
Transmitted to humans through the bite of an infected animal. Carried by bats, raccoons, skunks, foxes, and coyotes.
