



Writing Letters to For the Market Poultry Program

Potential Buyers Letters

Writing letters to potential market poultry buyers is an important part of the market poultry project. It helps to ensure that there will be an adequate number of buyers at the auction each year, but it also helps youth practice important skills such as communication, marketing, responsibility, and interacting with adults. Buyers are more likely to attend the auction if they get a personalized letter from a child!

Sometimes, knowing how to write a letter to a prospective buyer can be challenging. Below are some tips and ideas to help you and your child get started!

<u>Cloverbud</u>

- A few sentences are sufficient
- Letter can be written or typed by a parent (using child's words) and the child can sign their name
- Have the child draw a picture of them and their chicken!

Junior/Intermediate

- A few paragraphs should be written
- Letter should be written (preferred) or typed by the child
- The letter should include the following:
 - Information about yourself
 - Information about your club and project
 - \circ $\,$ What you have enjoyed and learned from the project $\,$
 - Fair & Sale Information such as date, time, and location (this will also be included on an invitation that the Extension Office will send with your letter)
- The child can include a drawing or photo of them and their chicken if desired





<u>Senior</u>

- The letter should be 1-2 pages, and should include multiple paragraphs
- Letter should be written (preferred) or typed by the child
- The letter should include the following:
 - Information about yourself
 - Information about your club and project
 - What you have enjoyed and learned from the project
 - Fair & Sale Information such as date, time, and location (this will also be included on an invitation that the Extension Office will send with your letter)
- The child can include a drawing or photo of them and their chicken if desired

Do's & Don'ts

- DO include a photograph of you and your chickens if possible
- DO make it personalized
- DO address the buyer by name for letters from personal list
- DO have an adult proofread the letter before turning it in
- DO write neatly or type your letter
- DON'T make your letter too short
- DON'T use a form letter
- DON'T just ask the buyer to purchase your animal or donate include more information, too!
- DON'T ask for a specific price for your bird
- DON'T add hardship stories

Thank You Letters

Thank you letters let those who support our program know how much we appreciate their support. Letters should be addressed to the names provided to you. This letter will be added to one sent from the office.

- The letter should be a couple of sentences long for Cloverbuds and one-half to one page long for juniors, intermediates, and seniors.
- Letters should be written (preferred) or typed by the child
- The letter should include the following:
 - Thanks for providing a donation/purchasing chickens





- What you liked about them, something you learned, how many years you've participated, etc. (much like what you wrote in buyer letter)
- \circ $\,$ Plans for next year $\,$
- A photo taken at the sale and show will be sent along with the letter.
