

Background: On October 2, 2021, Broward County Master Gardener Volunteer (Gaitrie Lee White) collaborated tirelessly with community and congregation members to utilize empty space in the back of Calvary Chapel church in North Lauderdale, Broward County, during COVID. Calvary Chapel Church Garden Space

Our newsletters are created by Master Gardener Volunteer (Gaitrie Lee White) using pictures taken from the garden and educational teachings. This newsletter benefits all members of the garden. It allows them to have materials that will be helpful, something to refer to when and if a situation arises, and they need a visual or information that pertains to the lesson. Documents from EDIS were used as educational tools for growing a successful community garden. The monthly calendar for South Florida is used as a guide for us to know when to plant and what we can plant during the growing season. Materials used in the educational portion from EDIS or State level MGVs are used to teach the members how to utilize science-based information to grow healthy food.

<u>Program Budget:</u> There is no actual budget for this project; it is all on volunteerism. All members donate materials for the garden.

<u>Garden Members:</u> We <u>have nineteen children and seventeen adults</u> who participated in the project. Their duties included removing sod, building garden plots, adding water resources, mulching, compost, building healthy soil, and a watering schedule. Our community garden not only impacted residents but also brought love and collaboration of church members who have the heart to serve others and meet the needs of those who are less fortunate. We look forward to starting our next season in August 2022 with our South Florida gardening guide.

This garden brought residents and church members together as a community, and friendships formed. Families learned to work in the garden, connect to nature with the skills, and experience I brought to them. Those who have yard space are now interested in growing their food. Participants who do not have the convenience of increasing their food find this garden an escape to learn and contribute their time.
