Dear 2024 Drill Team applicants and parents/guardians,

The 2024 Citrus County 4-H Drill Team will consist of 4-H members in good standing that have good attitudes and prior horse knowledge. The team members represent 4-H at the Citrus Stampede Rodeo. This event is the annual fundraiser for the county 4-H program.

Applicants must have completed a 4-H Demonstration/Illustrated Talk/Public Speaking at 4-H County Events (or make-up day); and turned in a completed 4-H Project Report/Record book. The Rodeo is scheduled for November 22nd and 23rd this year. Additionally, Drill Team members participate in 4-H Public Relations events, including, parades and events to raise money for equipment and clothing needed for the rodeo performance.

Safety of the riders and their horses is the first priority. You are expected to be able to control your animal at a walk, trot, canter and halt as well as move in a straight line and perform turns. You should know your proper leads, keep a good seat and have your equipment fitted and adjusted properly. The 4-H Drill Team leaders may limit the size of the team for safety.

A copy of your horse's negative Coggins is required to be turned in with your application to the 4-H Office by July 19, 2024, at 5 p.m.

The 4-H Drill team is a performance group, not a 4-H riding club. You must know how to ride properly before becoming a member of the team. You will be learning performance skills, not riding skills.

There will be a mandatory meeting to discuss practice dates and times, go over rules, etc. You will receive a phone call with the time and date of this meeting.

Citrus County 4-H Drill Team 2024 General Rules

- 1. All members must be current Citrus County 4-H members in good standing. To apply for the 2024 Drill Team you must have participated in 2024 County Events and turned in a 4-H Project Report/Record Book for the 2023/2024 year.
- A current negative Coggins must be submitted and remain on file for each horse that is being used for practices and/or riding during the two-day rodeo. It is the responsibility of the member and parent(s) to provide an updated Coggins, as needed. Ensuring the health and safety of all animals is a priority.
- 3. All members will complete a Drill Team application, a liability form, a participation form and submit all to the 4-H Office no later than July 19, 2024, at 5 p.m.
- 4. In the event the primary horse is unable to participate at the Rodeo performances November 22nd and/or 23rd, then the secondary horse may be substituted if the following apply:
 - a. A negative current Coggins for the secondary horse is provided.
 - b. The secondary horse has participated in at least 1 Drill Team practice.
- 5. Bring any items that your horse may need to practice. These items should include: hay bag, water bucket, and similar.
- 6. To ensure fairness and keep the team moving in a positive direction a formal penalty "Strike" system will be in place. A "Strike" will be issued to a rider when a rider or their parent/responsible adult breaks any of the Citrus County 4-H Drill Team 2024 General Rules
 - 1st Strike = a warning
 - 2nd Strike = rider is on probation
 - 3rd Strike = rider will be released from the Drill Team.
- 7. The 4-H Drill Team serves as representatives of the 4-H program. All members are required to fully participate in all Drill Team events which include the Citrus Stampede Rodeo, parades and other public relations events. At the Rodeo, team members are required to remain in the designated drill team area. Members are expected to participate in all Rodeo responsibilities; the performance drill, carrying sponsor flags, represent 4-H on horseback in the arena at intermission mingling with the crowd and Grand Entry.

- 8. Only 2024 Drill Team Members will be allowed to carry flags, in the arena during the rodeo. The exception will be employees of Five Star Rodeo and adults, as determined by the Drill Team Leader.
- 9. Members must maintain a good attitude and work cooperatively with the Drill Team leaders and their team mates, at all times. Each member comes to the team with individual talents and skills. Our goal is to build our team together.
- 10. Each rider must have a parent or an assigned "responsible adult" attending the entire length of each practice.
- 11. Do not bring dogs or other pets to practice.
- 12. Guests and spectators are strongly discouraged from attending drill practices and events. This is a time for working on the drill, not for socializing.
- 13. Member dress code: jeans, boots, T-shirt or other 4-H appropriate top (NO spaghetti straps). Riders are required to wear a black SEI or SEI/ASTM approved safety equestrian helmet, with fastened chin harness, at all times, while mounted.
- 14. Rodeo Dress Code:
 - (A) DARK BLUE JEANS (WITHOUT TEARS OR HOLES)
 - (B) WESTERN SHIRT PROVIDED TO TEAM MEMBERS
 - (C) WESTERN BOOTS
 - (D) 4-H JACKET ZIPPED UP (MAY BE USED)
 - (E) RIDING HELMET (BLACK PREFERRED)
- 15. Tack should be in good condition, fitting both the horse and rider. Horses should also be of an appropriate size matching that of their rider.

Rodeo required tack:

- (A) WESTERN SADDLE, HEADSTALL & BREAST COLLAR LEATHER
- (B) SADDLE PAD (matching covers to be provided)
- (C) SPLINT BOOTS
- (D) BRIDLE PATH TRIMMED OR NEATLY GROOMED
- (E) FLAG HOLDER
- 16. Members will attend each mandatory practice as scheduled. If you cannot attend a practice, you must call the drill team leader:
 - Rider must be appropriately dressed, with horse tacked and ready to go, 15 minutes before the scheduled start of practice.
 - Arriving late to practice will be counted as a tardy. Two tardies equal one Strike. Anything more than 30 minutes late will be counted as an absence. Any absence equals one strike.
 - You will be required to sign in at each practice. You will be required to stay after practice for a short team meeting.

- 17. A mandatory skills evaluation will determine the member's skill level and ability, and the horse's ability. The member must be able to control their animal at a walk, trot, canter and halt as well as move in a straight line and perform turns. The member should know proper leads, keep a good seat and have equipment adjusted properly. The size of the team may be limited for safety.
- 18. There will be at least two Rodeo dress rehearsals in the weeks prior to the Rodeo (dates to be announced). Members and their horses are expected to be dressed and tacked using Rodeo Dress code and Rodeo required tack.
- 19. For safety, each member must maintain control of their animal. Any horse or rider deemed unsafe will be excused from the team.
- 20. All horses must be in good health and condition. Any horse may be inspected by a licensed veterinarian (no charge to the participant). The objective of 4-H is to educate and promote quality animal husbandry; horses with a score of less than 4 based on the Henneke scale (http://bit.ly/4HHorse) will be excused.

This project requires **great commitment** on both the **<u>4-H member and their</u> <u>parents/guardians</u>**. I have read and understand the above rules for participation on the 2024 Citrus County 4-H Drill Team and I ACKNOWLEDEGE RECEIPT OF THIS AGREEMENT.
