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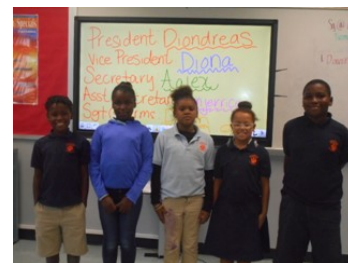

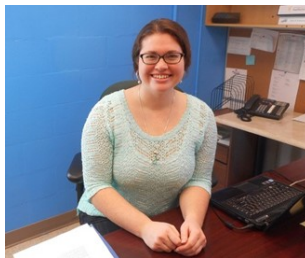

In 2018, we collected 1,901 lbs. from the community and we are hoping to exceed that this year! The great thing about this is that the **Peanut Producers Association** will match what is donated locally and all donated **peanut butter** will be distributed to food banks in Jefferson County.

Jefferson 4-H County Teen Council a club comprised of teens between the ages of 12-18, who work cooperatively with the Jefferson County 4-H Agent in planning and implementing 4-H Events in their area. The organization stresses youth leadership training, development and community service-learning projects. Jefferson County 4-H believes that all youth should have opportunities for positive youth development

GETTING 4-H EXHIBITS READY FOR THE NORTH FLORIDA FAIR

Exhibits can be actual items (pillow, garment, plant, photo, poster, etc.) or can be a free-standing tabletop exhibit.

Actual items should be **clean** and **neat**. Clothes should be well pressed and in good shape. Clothes that have been well worn would not be a good choice for display.

Food should be entered on a disposable container and some thought given to how it will appear to the public. Aluminum foil, gift wrap, or a doily may add to the attractiveness of the exhibit. Food is to be covered with plastic wrap and the recipe attached to the bottom of the container before wrapping. No **names** should appear on recipe. **Foods** are **“from scratch”** not a box, and **no** items needing refrigeration will be accepted.

Plants should be well groomed for the show. Plants are to be labeled with common name. To get plants ready for show, do the following.

- ☺ Wipe off all dirt and mildew on outside of pot.
- ☺ Remove dead or diseased blooms, stems, branches.
- ☺ Clean plant's leaves.

Photos must be mounted on a

mat, foam core, construction paper or poster board, **NO** other mounting material (glass, wood, plastic, or metal) will be considered.

When judging photos, judges consider (among other things):

- ☺ Main subject well positioned and sharply focused.
- ☺ Creativity in selecting subject.
- ☺ Message conveyed.
- ☺ Overall photo well balanced.

When making Posters:

- ☺ Plan
- ☺ Have a message
- ☺ Have enough space
- ☺ Consider color
- ☺ Use variety of techniques (pictures, textures, etc.)
- ☺ Consider lettering

Freestanding table top exhibit should measure a minimum of 28" X wide X 22" high and a maximum of 37" wide X 36" high. The posters should be sturdy and (hopefully) withstand some of the humidity. Mat board is a good choice as well as peg board and heavy duty cardboard (perhaps from an appliance box).

A pleasing tabletop exhibit could also include items placed in front of the poster(s) to convey the message more clearly.

The **entry forms** are due at the Extension Office on **October 3rd by 5:00 p.m. (Only the forms)**



RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CATTLE AND SWINE SHOWS

ALL EXHIBITORS

1. All participants between the ages of 8 and 18 must be a member of and show under 4-H or FFA. Youth must designate whether participation is 4-H or FFA by time of ownership. Youth must wear colors and/or emblems to designate 4-H or FFA participation while showing. (4-H'ers must be 8 years old by September 1, 2019 in order to show.)
2. 4-H and FFA participation is limited to one year after completion of high school.
3. Boundaries designated for this show are Madison, Jefferson, Hamilton, Suwannee, Taylor, and Lafayette counties.
4. The North Florida Livestock Show and Sale, Inc. assumes no liability whatsoever.
5. Individual exhibitors are limited to one entry in each cattle category. Organizations are limited to one entry in each cattle category and organizational exhibitors are limited to two entries in the swine show. Entry fees are \$15 per livestock entry, all entry fees are due with registration forms at weigh-in/tagging. Make checks payable to NFLSS, Inc. ALL 4-H participants MUST turn their entry forms in to the Madison 4-H Office.
6. All animals MUST come for weighing/tagging scheduled for October 26, 2019 from 8am-10am. Note: There will be NO early or late tagging this year. Animals not tagged by October 26th will not be allowed to show.
7. All Livestock entries must be turned in at the Mandatory Weigh-In/Tagging on October 26th, 2019.
8. Ag teachers, club leaders (4H/FFA) and Extension Agents who are supervising youth entries must certify that animals have been owned the required length of time.
9. **NEW THIS YEAR!!** Every animal must be housed on the premises of the exhibitor, chapter land lab, or 4-H land lab. If another location is used, it must be stated on entry form at the time of the initial tag-in. This place will be approved by NFLSS board of directors. All animals are subject to an unannounced premise check. If the entry is found not to be raised on the premise, the entry will be subject to disqualification.
10. AT SHOW CHECK-IN ON FEBRUARY 17TH, 2020, ANIMALS WILL ONLY BE WEIGHED ONE TIME.
11. All participants in 4-H or FFA are required to complete and turn in a record book for each entry before the annual show and sale.
12. Showmanship trophies will be given to the top junior (ages 8-11), the top intermediate (ages 12-15), and the top senior (ages 16-19) showmen in both the cattle and swine shows. To be eligible to win a showmanship trophy an exhibitor must follow the approved guidelines for cattle and swine showmanship. An individual may win awards as many times as he/she is showing an animal. Herdsmen's awards will be made in the cattle and swine barns. (Showmanship rules are available upon request.) September 1, 2019 is the date to determine age category. For example, a child that turns 12 after September 1 will still show as a junior.

- 13.** Exhibitors must provide water containers and feed troughs for cattle and swine entries. All exhibitors must provide feed for their animals.
- 14.** No individual animal may be shown in more than one class with the exception for the beef entries that are home grown.
- 15.** All single entries in the cattle and swine shows must be shown in the show ring by the exhibitor except when two singles are entered in the same weight class by an exhibitor or a satisfactory reason is given to and approved by the show management.
- 16.** Youth entries will be judged using the modified Danish system.
- 17.** The decision of the judges is final.
- 18.** Before payment of an animal is sent to the 4-H/FFA participant, a copy of the thank you letter sent to the buyer must be given to the Ag teacher, club leader or Extension Agent. Participants are encouraged to contact their own buyers when applicable. If a check is lost by exhibitor, the bank stop payment fee will be subtracted from the new check.
- 19.** A 5% sales fee will be deducted by the Association from the price received by the exhibitor to help defray expenses of the sale. Along with the beef council fee and pork council fee.
- 20.** No entries are to be given tranquilizer drugs within seven days of the show.
- 21.** The Livestock Barn will be closed at 11:00 p.m. Only show management is allowed in the barn after that time.
- 22.** It is understood that all exhibitors filing entries in the show agree to comply with these rules and regulations.

SWINE

- 23.** Swine entries will be received on Monday, from 8:00 AM until 11:00 AM. (The Swine show will begin at 6:00 PM) An Exhibitor meeting will be held at 4:30 PM in arena on Monday.
- 24.** In accordance with federal regulations, all swine must have Premise Identification tag to receive a NFLSS tag. Any Swine that does not have a Premise ID tag will not be tagged with the NFLSS tag and therefore WILL NOT be allowed to show. - 25.** Individual exhibitors can sell only one swine entry through the sale ring. Second entry will be sold to resale! Due to new Federal and State regulations NO SWINE will be allowed to leave the barn. ALL SWINE WILL BE SOLD.
- 26.** Exhibitors who show two swine will be required to sell the highest placing swine through the ring. The second swine will be sold by resale.
- 27.** Swine entries must weigh 220 to 295 lbs.
- 28.** Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Swine will be selected from the entries in the show. Top 5 will also be selected.

CATTLE

29. Cattle entries will be received on **Monday, from 1:00 - 4:00 PM. An exhibitor meeting will be held at 4:30 PM in arena on Monday.** (The Cattle show will begin at 6:00 PM on Wednesday). Under NO circumstances can cattle be removed earlier than 9:30 PM on Wednesday. Non-sale cattle **MUST** be removed by 12:00 (NOON) on Thursday.

30. Individual exhibitors can sell only one cattle entry through the sale ring. Organizations may sell 2 cattle entries. All Fat steers must sell through the ring. Feeder Steers and/or heifers may be sold but are not required. If cattle exhibitors choose to sell more than one entry the second cattle will be sold by resale.

31. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected from the entries in each division. Both a Home-Grown Grand Champion and Reserve Champion steer and heifer will be selected from those entries that meet the eligibility requirements (i.e. animal is born and raised on a participant's family farm in the six-county show area.). Top 5 will be awarded when applicable.

32. All entries will be subject to a screening committee. Cattle will not be allowed to show if not halter broken. If an animal is removed from the fairgrounds after weigh-in, the animal will not be allowed to enter the barn/arena area and will be disqualified from the show. All finished steers must weigh at least 900 pounds; be less than 24 months of age and should grade select or better. All feeder calves must weigh between 550 and 800 lbs. and grade at least medium one. All heifers must be between 8 and 24 months of age. Heifers must not have calved. Per the Florida Department of Agriculture all cattle are required to present a State Health Certificate at weigh in. Animals without a State Health Certificate will not be allowed to enter the barn/show.

33. All cattle must be tied with a rope halter and neck rope when not being shown. Cattle must also be dehorned.

34. No grooming chutes will be allowed under the covers of the building.

35. Cattle will be shrunk 3% when weighed in.

36. A weight gain contest will be conducted for exhibitors of finished steers. Steers must be weighed on certified scales by authorized personnel (i.e. Vo-Ag teacher or Extension Agent).

37. All steers must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification except for the grooming and treatment of the hair and the trimming of the hooves. No graphite, hair, cotton twine, etc. may be applied.

38. All cattle **MUST** remain within the closed in area, that has been designated by show management, for the duration of the show. (Any cattle entry caught outside the fenced area may be subject to disqualification)

Autumn Gold Peanut Soup



Serves: Makes 4 servings (1 1/4 cups or 300 ml)

Creamy peanut butter and golden yams lend rich color and a velvety texture to this elegant soup. Enjoy it as a prelude to any holiday or special-occasion dinner.

Ingredients:

1 tsp oil 5mL
1 cup chopped onion 250mL
1 tsp ground cumin 5mL
1 lb. yams, peeled and cut into chunks 450g
1 large green apple, peeled and cut into chunks
1 can chicken broth 14 1/2 oz.
1 can apple juice 6 ounces
1/8 tsp cinnamon 0.5 mL
salt and pepper to taste
1/2 cup creamy peanut butter 125 mL
garnish: sour cream, chopped peanuts, chives and thin apple slices

Directions:

Heat oil in large saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and cumin. Cook, stirring occasionally until onion is transparent. Add yams, apple, chicken broth, apple juice, cinnamon, and salt and pepper to taste.

Cover and bring liquid to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until yams and apples are tender, about 20 minutes. Add peanut butter and stir until melted.

Puree soup in a food processor or blender until smooth.

Return to pan and heat through.

To serve, ladle soup in bowls and garnish with sour cream, chopped peanuts, chives and thinly sliced apples.

Peanut Butter Banana Muffins



Serves: Makes 12 muffins

Cooking Time: 36 min

This recipe puts a spin on the classic combination of peanut butter and bananas. Topped with high-quality U.S. peanuts, these versatile muffins are a perfect treat!

Ingredients:

½ cup unsalted butter 125 mL
1/3 cup peanut butter 75 mL
1 ¼ cups all-purpose flour 300 mL
½ cup whole wheat flour 125 mL
2 tsp baking powder 10 mL
1 tsp cinnamon 5 mL
½ tsp baking soda 2 mL
¾ cup granulated sugar 175 mL
2 eggs 2
1 cup very ripe mashed bananas, about 2 large 250 mL
2 tsp vanilla 10 mL
1/3 cup unsalted peanuts, chopped 75 mL

Directions:

Preheat oven to 375F (190C). Lightly spray or grease 12 muffin tins. In a small saucepan melt butter over medium heat. Whisk in peanut butter. Pour into a large bowl to cool. In a medium bowl, place flours, baking powder, cinnamon and baking soda. Whisk together ensuring there are no lumps.

Stir sugar into cooled peanut butter mixture. Then stir in eggs until completely blended. Stir in bananas and vanilla. Gradually add flour mixture, stirring just until combined.

Spoon into muffin tins. Sprinkle with peanuts, gently pushing into batter. Bake in center of preheated oven until golden and a skewer inserted in cent comes out clean, 16 to 18 minutes. Remove muffins from pan to a rack to cool.

Description: Always a perfect pair, chocolate and peanuts come together in this tasty holiday square. Definitely a must have for a cookie exchange.

Ingredients

- ½ cup butter
- 2½ cups graham cracker crumbs
- 1 cup coarsely chopped peanut butter cups, about 4 regular size
- 1 cup each peanut butter chips and chocolate chips
- 1 cup peanuts
- 1 300 mL can sweetened condensed milk

Directions

Preheat oven to 350F (180C). In a medium saucepan, melt butter. Then stir in graham crumbs until blended. Pat firmly into ungreased 9 x 13-inch (3L) pan.

Sprinkle with chopped peanut butter cups, peanut butter and chocolate chips, then peanuts. Evenly drizzle condensed milk over top.

Bake in preheated oven until bubbly and deep brown around the edges, 30 to 35 minutes.
