4H COOL TIDBITS

4H HISTORY

There is not just one person that founded 4H, but several are credited with starting clubs in the early 1900s. The foundations began in 1902 which had the purpose of instructing rural youth in improved farming and home making practices. By the 1970s 4H broadened their programs to incorporate minorities and a wider range of life experiences. Back then adults didn't readily accept new Ag discoveries but youth did. Youth attending 4H clubs would share their experiences with their relatives and caused farms to be more productive and produce more for their families. This improved life for the rural community and provided much needed food for farming families.

The name 4H is a reference to the occurrence of the initial letter H four times in the organizations motto "head, heart, hands, and health" adopted in 1927. 4H is America's largest youth development organization which has been empowering nearly 6 million vouth with the skills to lead for a lifetime. 4H believes in the power of youth; that every youth has strength, and real influence to improve this world. All the programs are grounded in the belief that kids learn best by doing. This organization believes in diverse perspectives, values, and beliefs which generate better ideas to solve the complex problems of a changing world.

Today, the nearly 6 million youth are engaged in a variety of hands-on projects ranging from livestock production, to

healthy living, to environmental education, and incorporating life skills into the mix as well.

You may have wondered, what is the Jefferson County Extension office. It is part of a nation-wide informal educational system created by the federal Smith-Lever Act of 1914. This act created a partnership between state land grant universities, the USDA, and county governments.

Forest Ecology

-February to May 2021 -Project Implementation


- June 1st, 2021 - Project Reports

For those groups awarded grant monies in 2020 and have not completed their project due to the pandemic, they will be given a chance to update their project proposals in accordance with this adjusted 2021 cycle.
