The Florida 4-H Public Speaking Contest



Students in the 4th, 5th & 6th grade in Jefferson County participate in an exciting and challenging public speaking program.

The Florida 4-H Public Speaking school enrichment program is powered by Florida Power & Light (FPL). This educational program is designed to introduce fourth, fifth, and sixth-grade children to the concept of public speaking and is administered by Jefferson County 4-H.

Jefferson County students compete in the classroom and school-wide speaking contests, with winners advancing to the county competition.

Teachers and parents have been provided with instructional materials introducing the Florida 4-H Public Speaking school enrichment program.

For the past three months, students learned how to research, organize, and deliver a speech topic of their choice. Students received support at home through all process stages, from selecting a topic to preparing the final speech.

The Florida 4-H Public Speaking program builds confidence and provides a solid foundation for their future educational and professional aspirations.

The county-wide contest will be on December 6 at Aucilla Christian Academy Auditorium at 6pm. The district contest will be on April 22, 2023 at 1pm at the Wakulla County Extension Office.





Winter Plant Protection





Water



Keep your plant well-watered—watering plants before a freeze and after. Wet soil absorbs more heat during the day and radiates it at night. After a freeze, plants can lose water because of water being frozen. Watering the plants will help thaw the soil.

Mulch



Mulch with compost, wood chips, or straw around plants to help moderate temperature- keeps the soil warmer and retains moisture. Mulch also reduces weeds, decreases fruit disease, and improves the soil.

Covers

Coverings protect more from frost than from extreme cold. Examples of coverings include cloth sheets, quilts, plastic, or frost cloths. Covers extending to the ground and not touching plant foliage can lessen cold injury by trapping heat. Remove plastic covers during sunny days to allow ventilation.

Green Holiday Tips

The holidays are a time of generosity and spending time with loved ones, but they can generate more than just joy. Gift wrap, packaging and party goods can add up

to truckloads of extra waste. Celebrate the environment throughout the holiday season with these tips.

Decking the Halls

- Collect natural objects to use as table centerpieces and other decorations.
- Replace incandescent holiday lights with energy-efficient LED lights.
- Invest in an artificial tree for future years. If you choose a real tree, look to recycle it when the season ends.



- look for the Energy Star certification label.
- Buy rechargeable batteries and a battery charger to accompany electronic gifts.
- Find an electronic recycling program for devices that are being replaced.





- Use locally sourced ingredients when possible, and check your pantry for items you already have.
- Set out recycling bins when hosting events.
- Entertain with reusable dishes, utensils and cloth napkins instead of disposable items. If you must use disposable items, choose paper over plastic.

Wrapping Gifts

- Reuse paper items for wrappings, like brown paper bags or newspaper, or look for wrapping paper that is made from recycled content. Invite little ones to personalize with stamps, stickers or drawings.
- Make the wrapping part of the gift.
 Options include baking tins,
 planting pots or new towels.
- Avoid wrapping and top with a bow instead.



- Consider non-traditional gifts such as baked goods, plants, fishing licenses or gift certificates to local businesses, or check local markets for specialty foods or local art.
- Donate to a charitable organization in your loved one's name.
- Give "time." Help with chores, take children on an outing, or share your talent.




Before You Toss

- Save gift bags, ribbons, bows, boxes and packaging materials to use next year. If you can't keep it, find out what may be recyclable.
- Look up local tree recycling programs that turn trees into chip mulch.
- Find a new home for usable items that have been replaced by donating them to a local charity.
