The 4-H Embryology Program

This program will teach the participants about the life cycle of the chicken! Starting with the incubation of the egg, then the hatching process, and continue to the proper care for adult chickens.

The egg and poultry industry are very important parts of our agriculture and economic systems. The students will also have a better understanding of those systems.

Objectives of the program:

- Identify parts of the egg and their functions
- Make and record observations
- Observe and learn the stages of the embryonic development
- Provide proper post hatch care to the chicks
- Develop a greater appreciation for animal life

4-H Day at the North Florida Fair is Saturday, November 13. Jefferson County 4-H will transport 4-H Youth and adult volunteers on the bus to the Fair. The bus will leave the UF/IFAS Jefferson County Extension Office promptly at 10:30 A.M. and return around 5:00 P.M.

Parents /guardians are responsible for dropping off and picking up their child. The cost is \$1.00. A dollar will be refunded to the child if they return to the bus on time for departure.

An unlimited ride wristband can be purchased for \$15.00 from the 4-H Office. Wristbands are valid on 4-H Day only. Please provide your child with money for food.

The deadline to purchase wristbands is November 1, 2021.

The 4-H STEM Challenge at the North Florida Fair is on November 13th. The 2021 theme is Civil Engineering (Roller Coasters). 4-Hers will apply physics concepts to build a roller coaster that meets the challenge criteria for height, turns, and speed.

- All tools and supplies will be provided for each team.
- Teams will be asked to demonstrate their roller coaster in front of the judges and then give
- Reasons should include the following information:
 Which materials did you incorporated into your design and why?

 - What type of modifications did you make and why? How did your team work together to design and build the roller coaster? What is your prediction for how well your roller coaster will perform and why?
- Adults will not be able to assist members with the design or building of their roller coaster.
- A scoring rubric will be given to contestants when the challenge is released.

One Jefferson County 4-H Club can display their club work at the North Florida Fair. A club booth will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. The deadline to submit your request to the 4-H Agent is Monday, September 20th. See additional information below.

Booth Guidelines:

 Must fit in an 8' deep x 10' wide space and be completely free-standing.

No objects or exhibits may be pinned, hooked, or tied to the building, curtains, or curtain rods (failure to comply will result in premium forfeiture).

Must display county name and location of the UF/IFAS Extension Office in large, easy-to-see signage.
Include "How to Join 4-H" information.

Highlight life skills learned and knowledge gained from 4-H participation (may be specific to the club).

Be neat and attractive - thought and effort should go into the decor of the booth.

By order of the fire marshal, hay and straw are not permitted.

Booth Set-Up:

- Saturday, October 30 from 8am-5pm
- Sunday, October 31 from 12pm-7pm
- Monday, November 1 from 8am 5pm
- Tuesday, November 2 from 8am 5pm

*All booths must be set up by Wednesday, November 3 by 6pm. The county must furnish all supplies. Do not ask fair office for supplies.

Booth Take-Down:

- Sunday, November 14 from 9pm-11pm
- Monday, November 15 from 9am -3pm
- Tuesday, November 16 from 9am -3pm

If the club misses the set-up or removal deadline, the North Florida Fair will forfeiture the \$150 premium money.

Each 4-H members will be limited to one (1) registration form of exhibits with no more than six (6) exhibits in one class, except for classes 12 and 15, where members are limited to only one (1) entry and class 11, limited to three (3) entries. NO LIVE ANIMAL EXHIBITS WILL BE ACCEPTED IN THIS **DEPARTMENT.**

Exhibits should express 4-H learned experience completed within the past year, i.e., 4-H Club Meeting, project, or other 4-H event or activity. (Example of projects: dress, pillow, photograph, collections, canning,

4-H members wishing to exhibit articles not affiliated with their 4-H experiences; should enter the youth section of the Home Division (Dept. 510).

Let's Get Nutty - The 2021 PB Challenge!

It's fall and peanut harvest is here which means that it's time to spread the cheer (and protein) with the annual UF/IFAS Peanut Butter Challenge! The Extension Office would like to invite you to participate in this year's Peanut Butter Donation Challenge! The challenge will start **Friday**, **October 1st and end Wednesday**, **November 24th**.

Every year UF/IFAS Extension Offices across the Panhandle coordinate the Peanut Butter Challenge involving volunteer groups, clubs, organizations, businesses and schools to donate peanut butter to address hunger and food insecurity in our area.

The Florida Peanut Producers Association and the Florida Peanut Federation, made up of area farmers, support the Peanut Butter Challenge by matching local donations.

In 2020, we collected over 2,416 pounds of peanut butter from the community and this year we want to see if we can reach 2,500! Organizations can create their own collection box or the Extension Office can provide a collection box. If your organization would like to request a box, please give us a call at 850-342-0187.

We would also like to encourage the public to participate by dropping peanut butter off at a public drop off location. This year there will be public donation boxes in several locations: UF/IFAS Extension Jefferson County Office, Jefferson County R.J. Bailar Public Library, Capital City Bank, The First Bank, Piggly Wiggly, and Farm Bureau!

We will begin distributing peanut butter to local food banks in Jefferson County after the challenges ends!
