Suwannee Valley Watermelon Institute a Huge Success

On November 30, 2023 the Watermelon Institute was held at the Suwannee River Fairgrounds in Fanning Springs. Aside from watermelon producers, the 183 in attendance were UF/IFAS agents, specialists, and employees along with sponsors, stakeholders, and agencies to provide current and tested information to the producers and industry leaders. The morning sessions presented information about the grafting research being conducted on watermelons and fertilizer research updates that included data from research on controlled release fertilizer, all season liquid fertilizer fertigation programs, and paper mulch research. After an industry sponsored lunch, attendees heard about fungicide updates, weed management programs, and pollination information.

During lunch, a special presentation was made to Lafayette County's producer, Laura Land, as she was awarded the Outstanding Agriculturalist of the Year by the Extension Professionals Association of Florida. The annual conference was cancelled due to Hurricane Idalia so the next best place to recognize Mrs. Laura was amongst her peers and close friends in the watermelon industry of our area. Congratulations to Mrs. Laura for much deserved recognition of her support of watermelon research, the countless hours she has put into the promotion of Florida watermelons, and the integral part she plays in the success of their family farm.

Tips For A Healthy Poinsettia

We want those poinsettias to remain beautiful and just a few things to remember will ensure that. Indoor plants should be close to windows so they can receive some of that bright daylight and outdoor plants shouldn't get any more than 4-6 hours each day. Keep the soil moist but not saturated. In order to prevent saturation, remove the foil and allow the water to drain freely.
