The competition featured two segments: FITA and 3D. FITA, recognized by the Fédération International de Tir à l'Arc (FITA), is a renowned target shooting format used in international competitions. On the other hand, the 3D segment presented a unique challenge with life-sized artificial wild animals and reptiles strategically placed along a wooded trail.

For participants like Swinson and Cochran, the shooting distances in the FITA round varied based on their age divisions, adding an extra layer of challenge to the competition. While their journey didn't culminate in a national berth, their performance underscored their commitment and skill.
