WARNING!

TO FARM TOUR VISITORS

We have the opportunity to help our local growers & producers !

Florida has a new invasive insect that can seriously damage or even kill off a pasture in very short time with most all pasture grasses susceptible.

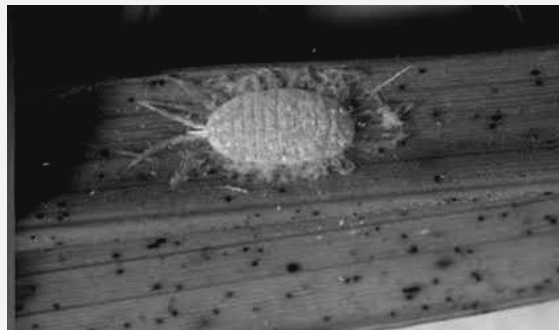
Bahiagrass, bermudagrass, limpograss, even crab grasses are all susceptible.

*Obviously, many of our farmers depend on their pastures—
as do many hunters.*

This species (pasture mealybug) feeds on the sap of pasture grasses, hayfields, turfgrass and sugar cane...and can take a field from a small hot spot of yellowing/browning grass to die back in just two weeks.

This insect has recently been detected in north Florida/Panhandle. These tiny bugs are 1/8—1/4" oval and covered in a white fuzzy wax.

So please help us not move it around during the Farm Tour! Mealybugs travel on boots, clothing, tools and tires. Knock the dirt off your shoes between stops and please stay on designated paths or areas the farm suggests.

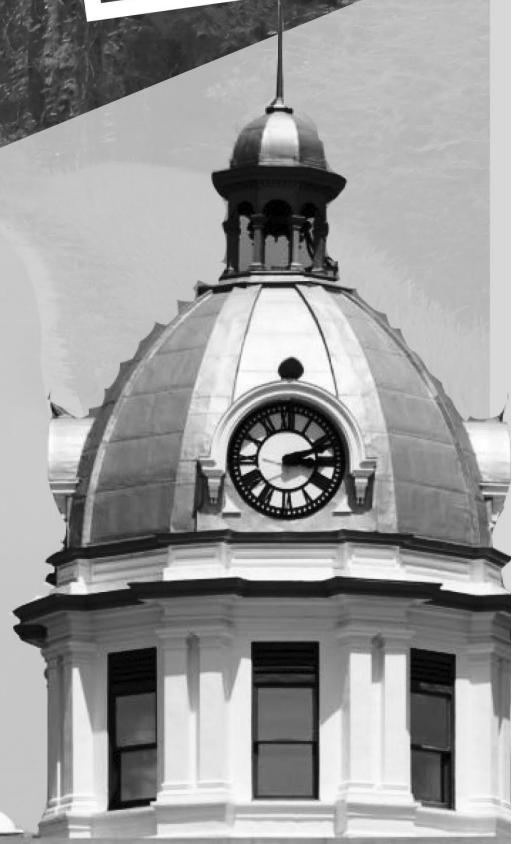

Safety On The Farm

There are things to be careful of on a farm—there's equipment, livestock, sharp fence lines, wagons, and so forth, therefore it's important to pay attention while you have fun!

There are state statutes in both Florida and Georgia that address having the public out on the farm.



Under Florida law, an agritourism operator is not liable for injury or death of, or damage or loss to, a participant in an agritourism activity conducted at this location if such injury, death, damage, or loss results from the inherent risk of the agritourism activity. Inherent risks of agritourism include, among others, risks of injury inherent to land, equipment, and animals, as well as the potential for you to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to your injury death, damage, or loss You are assuming the risk of participating in this agritourism activity.

Under Georgia law, there is no liability for an injury or death of a participant at least 18 years of age in a registered agritourism activity conducted at a registered agritourism location if such injury or death results from the inherent risks of such agritourism activity. Inherent risks of agritourism activities include, but shall not be limited to, the potential for you to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to your injury or death and the potential of another participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to your injury or death You are assuming the risk of participating in this registered activity.

Southern Craft Creamery will be on your right at 2884 Jefferson Street

Southern Craft Market will be directly across Market Street from the Creamery at 2886 Jefferson Street

Cindale Farms is farther up Jefferson Street for another 3.0 miles then turn left on Old US Road (CR167.) Travel 3.0 miles and turn right on 3958 Old US Road (Circle Bar Lane) The farm will be straight up the dirt lane until you reach the parking area near the large barn.

Compost Community operates on the site of Frenchtown Urban Farm. We also border a community garden and beekeeper! We are a small (1/3 of an acre) farm that is a demonstration site for our compost and vegetable production.

We produce all of our own soil amendments and utilize that compost to grow all of our own food naturally without any chemical or synthetic additives.

We have fruit trees on site, along with a vermicompost system for those interested in red wiggler worms. Every day we tend to 7-10 compost piles. We utilize best practices, adhering to organic standards for compost production.

DIRECTIONS: In Tallahassee: From the **north**, south on old Bainbridge Road and right on Dunn. From the **south**, go north on Macomb, cross Brevard and turn left onto Dunn. From the **east**, west on Tennessee Street (Hwy 90) and right on Macomb, cross Brevard and left on Dunn. From the **west**, east on Tennessee (Hwy 90), left on Macomb, cross Brevard and left on Dunn.

Here at Tupelo's, we pride ourselves on cooking and baking from scratch with the best ingredients possible. We are open for breakfast and lunch five days a week with a selection of freshly baked pastries and quiche, and a full lunch menu with sandwiches and salads. The bread for all of our sandwiches is baked fresh daily, and the soups and salads often feature locally grown meats and produce. Come visit!

We have proudly been part of the farm tour since 2009 !

The mission of Deep Roots Meat is to make meat a health food product by raising our livestock with regenerative practices which enrich the earth and human health. We have around 1,000 acres of pasture that our cattle and other livestock thrive on. We have been in the cattle business for six generations and have been raising All Grass (Forage) Fed Beef for over 20 years.

Our Red Angus-influenced cattle are bred, born, and raised on our ranch. They only eat high-quality grasses, forages, and hay that we grow and bale. To grow the grasses and forages, we implement practices such as rotational grazing, no-till planting, and fertilizing with organic fertilizers, including fish emulsions and seaweed. Our cattle are NOT fed any grain or animal by-products and are NOT supplemented with GMOs.

In 2023, we diversified our ranch to include other livestock. On the same grasses and forages, we added All Grass (Forage) Fed Lamb and Goat, and Pasture Raised Pork, Chicken, and Eggs. The only animals that receive feed supplementation are the pigs and chickens. The feed ration is soy-free and made specifically for the pigs and chickens at the ranch. Our livestock are NEVER given antibiotics, hormones, or mRNA vaccines. We use low-stress handling techniques that make all the animals happy!

With the way we raise our livestock, you can taste the difference. Try our meat without ANY seasonings. Not

We began our family farm in 2001 and it continues to evolve...different crops, different livestock...working to find the best balance for our family and for our land.

Golden /acres Ranch is situated just north of the small town of Monticello on forty-three acres of pasture and groves. 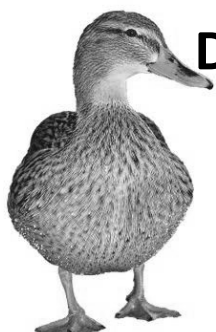

DIRECTIONS: From the courthouse round-about in Monticello, head north on Highway 19. Go 4 miles to Barnes Road (a large sign on the right.) Turn right and travel 3/4 of a mile to our drive—follow signs.

We are a family owned and operated bio-intensive market garden that uses human scale techniques, compost, and other natural fertilizers and no synthetic pesticides, herbicides, or fertilizers. We make a living on our small plot by using high intensity methods to grow at least 3 crops a year on any given garden.

Come see what all can be done on a small plot of land. We will be demonstrating some of the small scale, intensive tools and techniques that we use including: BCS two wheel tractor and implements, irrigation systems, bed layout, caterpillar tunnels, seed drills, cultivation, etc.

DIRECTIONS: From Tallahassee, go east on I 10, take exit 217 onto State Road 59 (also called Gamble road)

and turn right. In .6 miles (at caution light) turn left onto Old Lloyd Road and proceed 2.3 miles. Turn right onto Cardinal Lane. (NOTE: if you cross back over I 10 you've gone too far!)

From Cardinal Lane, take the first right onto Robin Road and after .4 miles turn right onto Murmuring Creek Road. Continue straight. You will cross over the railroad tracks and the road will turn to dirt. Continue until the road dead ends into E Osprey Lane After .7 miles turn left.

You will gradually drive up a hill and turn left at 399 E Osprey Lane after .4 miles. You will see our house and greenhouse set back on the property. The drive is on the right side of the property. We will also post Farm Tour signs along the way to assist in finding us!

Founded in 1989 and Certified Organic from the beginning, Ladybird Organics is a 50-acre farm set-up to sustainably produce fruits, vegetables, small grains, and nuts. It was registered as a Florida nursery to propagate, replace, and sell plants. The vermiculture system developed on site produces the rich organic fertilizer—worm castings—used throughout the farm and available for purchase.

The history of this farm is unique—from its location in the Red Hills bioregion (some of the best water and soil in Florida!) to the design and layout of the fields and the evolution of practices for sustainability.

Ten years after beginning the farm, and after winning a gold medal at the State Fair in hobby winemaking, we became serious about fermentation. By 2001 we

were certified, licensed, and bonded as a Florida Farm Winery with the name Monticello Vineyards & Winery.

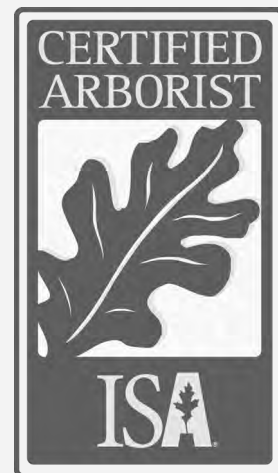

From Highway 84: Turn onto Hall Road in Cairo. Farm is 1.5 miles on the right.

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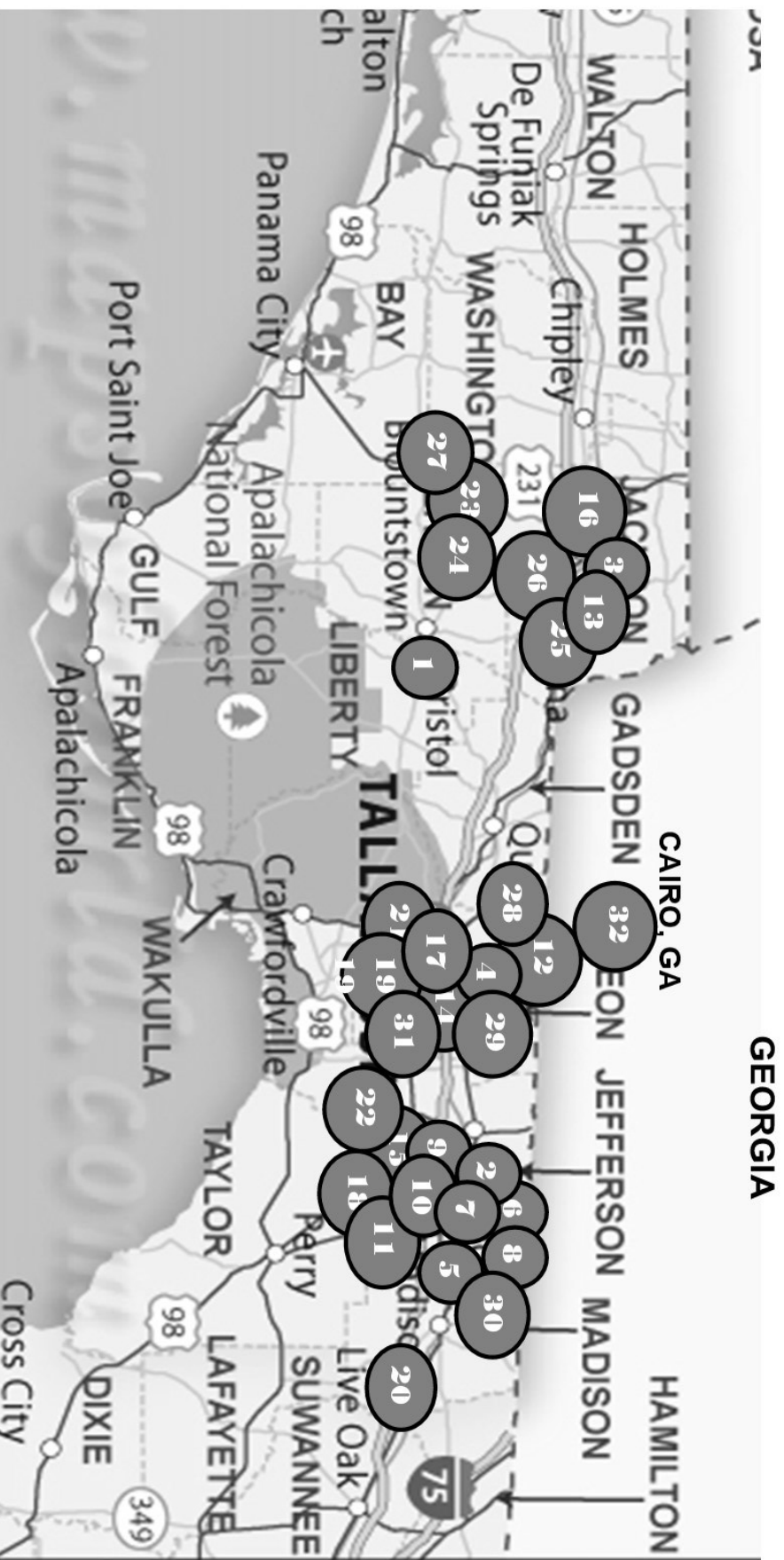
