General Information

- -For example enter: "EDIS Crane Pitaya"
- -EDIS (Electronic Data Information Source) is the robust UF database of our publications.
- -Crane is the last name of Dr. Jonathan H. Crane, who has worked with these crops in South Florida for 30 years or more as the tropical fruit specialist at UF's Tropical Research and Education Center. If Dr. Crane is the author, you can trust the information as relevant to South Florida.
