Wearing a hat each day of camp is highly recommended!

- For safety reasons parent/guardian must come in and sign camper(s) in each morning and out at the end of each day. Parent must sign a permission slip for anyone not listed on the registration form to pick up their child at camp.
- H20 Camp will provide a light breakfast, water refills, and lunch each day of camp. Please send a refillable water bottle with your camper.
- We will spend most of our week outdoors. Please be sure to apply sunscreen each morning and send extra sunscreen with your camper each day.
- Read and follow the camp rules and code of conduct on the back of this page.

General Rules for all Camps

- 1. A camp registration, camp fee, and a health and participation form must be turned in at the Extension Office before campers may attend and participate at camp.
- 2. Due to the nature of our camp, misconduct will not be tolerated and will be dealt with immediately. Please read the Code of Conduct and the Florida 4-H Participation Form thoroughly, you and your camper both signed this agreement.
- 3. The designated camp T-shirt MUST be worn every day.
- 4. Please plan to drop off and pick up your child on time each day. <u>Do not bring children earlier than 15 minutes before the scheduled drop off time, and do not drop them off if there is not an adult present.</u> Buses will return at the designated time, barring any unforeseen circumstances or emergencies.
- 5. Send only what your child can be responsible for, the Extension Office and camp staff will not be held responsible for lost, left, or misplaced items.
- 6. Participants should use sunscreen at all times, an SPF of 30 or higher is recommended.
- 7. Please identify all belongings with a marking pen before sending them to camp with your child.
- 8. If your child is unable to attend a day of camp, please notify the Extension Office at (863)763-6469, or please notify another camp parent or staff member as soon as possible so that we will know not to expect your child at camp that day.
- 9. Please pack any snacks/drinks in clear Ziploc bags. Absolutely NO GLASS BOTTLES are permitted. All items should be clearly marked with the camper's name for identification.
- 10. Clothing please dress appropriately but comfortably for the designated days activities.

Code of Conduct and Discipline

Standards of conduct are established and should be reviewed with all persons prior to arriving at camp by the "adult in charge" at the beginning of the camp week. Participants are expected to understand, respect, and act in accord with these standards as they support the goal of maintaining the health, safety, and well-being of all persons attending, while also ensuring that all can benefit from the planned teaching and learning opportunities.

- I. Standards
 - Persons in attendance are expected to participate in all components of the planned program. Persons in attendance are expected to be responsive to all requests of the adult in charge
 - Persons in attendance will be respectful of their own need for personal safety and the safety of others
 - The possession of and/or use of alcoholic beverages, non-prescription drugs, narcotics, firearms, and/or other weapons, tobacco and tobacco products, is strictly prohibited at all times
 - The malicious destruction or theft of personal, state, county, or 4-H property is unacceptable
 - Gambling for money is not permitted
 - Bullying <u>in any form is</u> not permitted and will be dealt with immediately
- II. Participants accused of any of the following will be required to appear before a review board:
 - Possession or use of illegal drugs or alcoholic beverages
 - Theft, misuse or abuse of public or personal property
 - Sexual misconduct
 - Possession of weapons or firearms
 - Physical assault
- III. If the accused participant is found to be in violation of any of the offenses listed above in II, his/her parents will be notified; and the participant will be sent home immediately at the parent's expense and may be suspended from participation in other 4-H activities for a period of 12 months
- **IV.** Participants accused of any of the following may be required to appear before a review board:
 - Use of abusive language
 - Absence from group after leaving county
 - Bullying activity
- V. If the accused participant is found to be in violation of the offenses listed in IV above and receives discipline issued by the review board, his/her parents will be notified, and the participant may be sent home immediately at the parent's expense and may be suspended from participation in other 4-H activities for a period of 6 months
- VI. Realizing that these guidelines are not all inclusive, the Extension Office reserves the right to make adjustments to these policies. Please review the general
- VII. Notification Procedures

If a participant is found to be in violation of the Code of Conduct and is to be sent home, the person in charge of the activity will notify the respective parents

VIII. Review Board

A Review Board will be appointed at the beginning of the camping season by the Agent Coordinator. A copy of the Review Board procedures is available and on file at the Extension Office.

IX. <u>Appeal Procedures</u>

If a participant wishes to appeal the decision of the Review Board, he/she must appeal in writing through the Extension Office. Appeals must be filed within 30 days following notification of punishment

As necessary, the Agent Coordinator shall appoint an Appeal Board to meet no sooner than 30 days, nor later than 60 days following the date of the 4-H campers' request. The Appeal Board shall consist of:

- A County Extension Agent
- A volunteer leader
- Three 4-H members
- Camp coordinator or Extension Agent Coordinator
