This national award-winning webinar program ran from 2015 - 2020, offering 30 live-streaming webinars on topics ranging from invasive species to tips for creating wildlife-friendly spaces. Follow-up surveys of webinar participants showed improved understanding of living with wildlife after watching these episodes, and they made simple changes in their life to co-exist more peacefully with area wildlife.
