Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow Brunfelsia pauciflora

This plant has low severity poison characteristics and can be a problem for cats, dogs and horses. Other common names include today, tomorrow, together; yesterday, today and tomorrow; morning-noon-and-night; kiss me quick and Brazil raintree. Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow can make a stunning seasonal display. It blooms in the warm months of the year with color-changing flowers that start out lavender or purple and fade to white over the next day or two.

Type: perennial evergreen shrub

USDA hardiness zones: 9 through 11

Uses: specimen; hedge; containers

Origin: not native to the United States

Height: 3 to 5 feet Spread: 2 to 4 feet

Plant spacing: 3 to 4 feet

Light requirement: full sun to part shade

Soil tolerances: sand; silt; loam; acidic;

well drained

Drought tolerance: good

Soil salt tolerances: moderate

Invasive potential: not known to be invasive

Pest resistance: resistant to pests/diseases


