## **Podocarpus**

## Podocarpus macrophyllus

With densely foliated lower limbs which reach the ground and neat, dark green, evergreen leaves Buddhist Pine, also known as southern yew, is very popular as a dense screen or hedge. However, Buddhist Pine can reach 30 to 40 feet in height when not sheared and is quite attractive as a tree. This is one of only a few trees which can be pruned into a nice hedge. The dark green foliage and dense growth creates a formal mass.

Type: large shrub to small tree

USDA hardiness zones: 8b through 11

**Uses:** screen; specimen; shade; hedge; reclamation;

espalier; deck or patio

Origin: not native to North America

**Height:** 30 to 40 feet **Spread:** 20 to 25 feet

Plant spacing: use dependent

**Light requirement:** full sun to part shade

**Soil tolerances:** clay; sand; loam; alkaline; acidic;

well-drained

**Drought tolerance:** high

Aerosol salt tolerances: high

**Invasive potential:** not considered a problem

**Pest resistance:** resistant to pests/diseases
