July 4th Picnic less than \$6 per person

The American Farm Bureau survey results found that Americans probably paid a bit more for their Independence Day picnic this year. Farm Bureau's data showed that the average cost for a summer picnic for 10 people is \$58.72, or \$5.87 per person. Farm Bureau data shows that's about a 5% increase compared to last year.
