

STEPS FOR SLC 4-H ENROLLMENT




4-H ENROLLMENT IN ST. LUCIE COUNTY 4-H IS AN ANNUAL PROCESS



STEP 1: NEW FAMILIES: Contact the club leaders of the 4-H Clubs you are interested in, ask if there is still space available (see information below), and make every effort to attend meetings to find your family's best fit. If space is not available, please contact our office so we can assist. IMPORTANT: if you are not a returning family, please do not register online until you have attended a meeting or contacted our office.

Online Enrollment - required by the Florida State 4-H office, enroll via https://v2.4honline.com/ and pay the annual \$20 Membership Fee required by the state 4-H office for members 8-18 (Cloverbuds ages 5-7 are exempt from the membership fee).

- Once 4-H Online enrollment is complete it should say "Submitted" and will be changed to "Approved" once we have confirmed through the 4-H Club leader that you have reached out, visited a meeting, and there is room for your family in their club.

FL 4-HFood Challenge Club: We are seeking youth who are interested in joining the 4-H Food Challenge Club. The 4-H Food Challenge is a contest that provides a fun, yet challenging, food-focused learning opportunity. Youth work in teams of 3-4 youth, of the same age division, to create a dish using a predetermined set of ingredients and cooking utensil/equipment. First, each team plans and prepares one of the randomly assigned dish while being judged on their food safety skills, teamwork, and ability to manage time and resources. Then youth present their finished dish, deliver a five-minute presentation, and answer questions about their dish to a panel of judges. Youth can enroll for this competition and have it be their primary focus and club or this could be a secondary club for youth who are currently enrolled in a primary club but would also like to be part of the Food Challenge Team.
