Spotlight on My Favorite Plant Peacock Ginger By: Jenny Lorch, MGV

When I moved into my new home, there was an established garden. The first year was so interesting watching all the flowers come up. I never knew what or where the next flower would appear. Since I came from Colorado, all the flowers were new and different. By the end of May I thought I'd seen them all. But low and behold little oblong tubes started to show up. These small tubes turned larger, then evolved into big leaves. The leaves were elaborately striped shades of green and spread out into a fan shape. Small pink and purple flowers appeared. These plants turned out to be Peacock Ginger which only grow about 4" to 10", are very hardy, and come back better each year. As they are very easy to divide, I have spread them along the edge of the garden bed.

Peacock Gingers love shade and are grown in hardiness zones 8 - 11. They are not poisonous to people or animals. They lose their leaves in the winter but come back strong in late Spring. The Florida Garden Select Plant program has recognized the Peacock Ginger as a plant that grows well in Florida.



Native coral honeysuckle (Lonicera sempervirens) grows all over Florida. The vine features bright red, tubular flowers. The flowers attract hummingbirds and butterflies.


