#### Wakulla Wonderful 2025 Committee Members Needed!

Wakulla Wonderful is the annual celebration of the county's founding date. In 2019, Wakulla 4-H members and volunteers celebrated the day the county was founded on March 11, 1843 with a birthday party on the Wakulla County Courthouse lawn. Since that year, the celebration has grown to become a full day festival. In the weeks leading up to the county's birthday, the community is encouraged to get outside and Walk Across Wakulla. The 32 mile

walking goal was established in 2021 as a way to celebrate the county leading up to the festival.

The 2025 festival will be held Saturday, March 8 from 10 AM to 2 PM in the Wakulla Courthouse Square. Committee meetings begin in September 2024. Adults and youth are welcome to serve on the committee!

# 4-H Youth Project Continues to Make a Difference

Each year, Wakulla 4-H youth plan and execute one or more service projects to benefit the local community. Prior projects have included hurricane clean-up efforts, disaster preparedness buckets for senior citizens, a rain barrel installation at the local library, a senior center prom, and a Blessing Box at the Extension office. From 2022-2023, 4-H youth wanted to engage the community in efforts to preserve the natural beauty of Wakulla.

They noted an increase in littering throughout the community and partnered with Keep Wakulla County Beautiful to help raise awareness and plan a hands-on effort.

Youth issued a challenge to the community to join them in raising awareness about working together to keep the county free of litter. Youth also interviewed two community leaders about their work with Keep Wakulla County

Additionally, the youth worked with local artist Rachell Mathis to design three original art pieces to promote an anti-littering message. This artwork is featured on road signs installed around the county on major roads. Keep Wakulla County Beautiful adopted one of the designs as the 2023 International Coastal Clean Up t - shirt design!

In 2023, the project was recognized by Keep Florida Beautiful as Outstanding Collaboration for 2023 and in 2024. One of the podcast episodes was recognized as the top 4-H podcast in the nation!
